
iMember 2.0 has tremendous features for all brothers including member posts, lodge calendar, deciding how you want to receive communication from our lodge and printing your 2021 dues card.



It seems that more than ever we see incivility all around us. What tools does Freemasonry provide to help cope with the current state of affairs? Can Masons help restore civility in society? Join Past Grand Master Russ Charvonia as he discusses how the fraternity can help improve our civil society by improving ourselves.

THINK ABOUT IT

The professional football team that currently is ▲ in Washington DC has been called the Redskins since 1933. Its fight song, "Hail to the Redskins", was played whenever the team scored a touchdown. However, the team name created controversy because some thought it was degrading to Native Americans. Last year, the team dropped that name, becoming the Washington Football Team; the fight song was not played in 2020 and official team merchandise no longer display the logo (a profiled Indian similar to what is seen on the buffalo nickel). Now the professional baseball team in Cleveland is abandoning the name it had since 1915 (Indians). The name transition will be completed by 2022 and the team logo, known as Chief Wahoo, has already been removed.

Any would argue that it is appropriate to eliminate from our society any references that disparage certain individuals. On the other hand, I wonder when this will stop. What will happen to the Atlanta Braves, the Kansas City Chiefs, and the Cincinnati Reds? Will the Buffalo Bills have to change the name of their city as well? Since children play Cowboys and Indians, what about the Dallas Cowboys or even the Texas Rangers or Houston Texans?

The potential problem extends beyond Native Americans. Are the Cleveland Browns showing disrespect to Latin Americans? If we do not want to slight people who have different, or even no, religious beliefs, what should be done with

the San Diego Padres, New Orleans Saints, and Anaheim Angels? The Kansas City Royals name is close to the team from the same city that played in the old Negro Leagues (Kansas City Monarchs). The organization People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) is, according to its website, opposed to "speciesism" (which is defined as a human-supremacist worldview); being sensitive to its members means abandoning Marlins, Cardinals (Arizona and St. Louis), Cubs, Diamondbacks, Blue Jays, Orioles, Rays, Tigers, Falcons, Panthers, Bears, Lions, Rams, Eagles, Seahawks, Ravens, Bengals, Broncos, Colts, Jaguars, and Dolphins. If the image of having women raped at sea by hostiles on other boats is an affront, say goodbye to the Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, and even the Las Vegas Raiders. If you are not tall, Giants (New York football and San Francisco baseball) and Titans are not acceptable. If you do not drink alcohol, what about the Milwaukee Brewers? Prospectors in the old west were virtually all men; will women object to the San Francisco 49ers?

Are all of these teams out of sync with our current times? Or is it simply the failure of many of us just to grow a thicker skin?
