

THINK ABOUT IT

On an almost daily basis, I see examples of people with strong beliefs about one thing or another, be it political points of view, sports teams, forms of entertainment, or many other topics, being unable to say what they think without some type of verbal, and even occasionally physical, assault in response. Just in the past couple of days, the Speaker of the House called the Minority Leader a moron and he responded with a threat to hit her with a gavel (allegedly made as a joke), gymnastics fans made demeaning commentary about Simone Biles, and promaskers and anti-maskers have continued their antagonistic and occasionally violent demonstrations.

Contrast these behaviors with how Masonry deals with disagreements. Ionic-Composite Lodge meets in a two-story building that we bought in the late 1950's. The lodge is on the second floor, with the first floor largely used as rental space. Several years ago we had a flood that gutted that entire first floor; the damage was so severe that our insurance and/or our other resources could not pay for the necessary repairs and we lost the rental income. After receiving an unsolicited bid to buy the building and subsequently investigating the real estate situation, the Building Association decided that the sale of the building would be the best course to pursue. As it is not a straightforward matter to sell a Masonic property in California, we went through a number of administrative hoops to list the property and

then decide on which of several bids to accept. Once that decision was made, the process requires a 2/3's vote of approval by the lodge. This became the main business topic at the July Stated Meeting.

When the discussion began, there were a number of members who were passionately opposed to the sale for a variety of reasons, often related to the fact that that building was the only Masonic home that they knew, and they provided alternative plans. Proponents of the sale also made cogent arguments. Virtually every member who was present at the meeting spoke at some time. In spite of the strong feelings on both sides, the remarkable thing about the discussion was that it was cordial. Everybody listened carefully to all of the opinions that were expressed. Unlike most public discussions that we are used to seeing in person or in the media, there was no shouting, name-calling, personal attacks, or doubts expressed about the sincerity of the other speakers. At the end of the discussion, one of the brothers commented that he was very glad that he came because it reminded him of why he became a Mason in the first place. At the end, all of the Masons who were present agreed that the main thing that the lodge needed to do was to be successful, and we truly departed in peace and harmony.
