

THINK ABOUT IT

The topic of political correctness has been finding its way into these columns on a regular basis; in fact, this column written in October will be the third time in 2021. In principle, practitioners of political correctness believe that their concerns are sparing the feelings of groups of people who are offended or otherwise put down by particular words or phrases. However, this movement may now have met a new high (or perhaps low).

The organization PETA (People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals) has long waged a verbal campaign against "speciesism", which it views as a "human supremacist worldview". PETA believes that we need to stop using terms that "trivialize cruelty to animals" and instead appreciate animals for "who they are". For example, they want the phrases "packed like sardines" and "bring home the bacon" to be replaced with "packed like pickles" and "bring home the bagels". They also want us to start crying over "burnt toast" instead of over spilled milk (although I do not understand why spilled milk is viewed as anti-animal terminology). Now PETA is going after Major League Baseball.

A bullpen is the area of the field where pitchers warm up before entering a game. However, PETA notes that a bull's pen is an area where bulls are kept prior to slaughter or to being electrically prodded in rodeos, so the baseball term is a word with "speciesist roots" and "mocks the misery of sensitive animals". PETA went so far as to claim that the word bullpen devalues talented players. Their Executive Vice President, Tracy Reiman, has offered the term "Arm Barn" as alternative nomenclature. I guess that Ms. Reiman did not find that term potentially offensive to amputees.

I am not sure how seriously PETA took this matter, since, in their press releases, their spokespeople employed various baseball terms in what appeared to be a spirit of humor. For example, they suggested that we "strike out the word bullpen", asked fans to "changeup their language", and stated that the term "Arm Barn" would be a "home run for fans, players, and animals".

My comments about political correctness are not intended to denigrate the fact that there are words and thoughts in our community that are capable of doing real harm. However, in this case I was not sure how any non-human creatures (the lives that PETA focuses on) were being adversely affected. PETA did not provide any evidence that cows took offense at the word "bullpen" (or even understood English) or follow baseball. Rather, I fear that PETA has raised this issue during the World Series to bring attention (and perhaps more importantly, donations) to itself.
