#### **HOW TO GET YOUR DUES CARD**

With the installation of the iMember 2.0 online system a few years ago that all brothers can access upon registration, lodge secretaries no longer receive all the dues cards to mail out after payment.

## Think About It - Ron Koretz, P.M.

When I was in high school in the late 1950s, standardized testing was routine, and the results would become part of one's application to college. More recently, however, those tests, usually the SAT or ACT, have come into disfavor because members of certain minorities have not scored as well as other ethnic groups. In fact, standardized tests have even been labeled as "racist" in some circles. Some colleges have ceased asking for those results, thereby removing them as factors to be considered in decisions about admission.

I spent several years as the chairman of a scholarship committee that had many more applicants than we had the ability to reward. In fact, the main purpose of the committee was to go through all the applications and select those whom we believed would be the most likely to succeed in college. Over the course of the time that I reviewed applications, it became clear to me that the grade point averages, or GPAs, were becoming higher and higher. When I was in high school, the highest GPA that could be attained was 4.0, representing As in all a student's classes. However, by the time I finished my tenure as chair (2022), it was commonplace for us to review paperwork from high school students who had "adjusted" GPA's of 4.5 or even higher. This occurred because the students were taking advanced placement, or AP, classes that earned them extra GPA point scores. I also suspected that many teachers in high school were providing "grade inflation", namely giving higher grades to students in general. Since the grades all came from disparate sources, I did not have the ability to compare what a particular grade meant at any one high school.

The standardized tests were developed, in part, to predict how a particular student would do in college. In fact, there is a good correlation between one's SAT or ACT scores and one's college GPA. Thus, and especially when I was evaluating a student who had a high GPA in high school but a relatively low SAT or ACT score, to put less emphasis on the GPA (and I also only considered the unadjusted GPA in my decision-making).

To be fair to the GPA, there are several studies that have compared the predictive value of both standardized tests and the GPA. Many (but not all) of these studies have suggested that the GPA is a better predictor of success in college. These studies have been cited by college admission officials as the reason to disregard the standardized scores in favor of only using the GPA. Curiously, what has been less intensively studied is the ability of using both scores to predict success. In my brief Google search of the Internet, I came across one such study that found that the use of both tests was superior to either one alone.

I am no longer a member of any admissions (or scholarship) committees. My opinion, should I be asked, would be to use both, but it is unlikely that anybody is going to ask. What I am concerned about is a decision not to use standardized test simply to try to fix a perceived problem with ethnic or racial bias in society.
