Think About It – Ron Koretz, P.M. Think About It

Ron Koretz, P.M.

Dr. Bryant Lin has been a primary care physician and educator at the Stanford University School of Medicine for almost 20 years. During that time, he also founded the Center for Asian Health Research and Education and pursued research into diseases that particularly affect Asians.

He also is the director of the Stanford Medical Humanities and the Arts program. He is almost 50 years old. In May 2024, he was diagnosed with stage IV non-small cell lung cancer, a malignancy that is not due to smoking but is associated with a genetic mutation that is disproportionately found in Asians. Unfortunately, at the time of his diagnosis, he was found to have metastases in his bones, liver, and brain.

Most people, including doctors, would very likely turn inward, step back from their careers, and try to make the most of their remaining time with their family and friends. Dr. Lin chose a different path. He created a course in the medical school, MED 275, which consisted of a series of discussions about aspects of his disease.

He began the first session of the course by reading a letter that he received from a patient some two weeks after that patient had died. It read: "Dear Dr. Lin: I wanted to thank you for taking such good care of me in my old age. You treated me as you would treat your own father, with humor and care and great professional skills." The fact that it arrived posthumously suggested to Dr. Lin that the patient had spent some of his last hours writing it. The implication of this letter was that Dr. Lin was going to spend the last months of his life making a message to those who would remain after him.

The curriculum for MED 275 consists of various aspects of lung cancer, including its impact on mental health, the activities of caregivers, spirituality, ethics, nutrition, available treatment, and the epidemiology (including the possible genetic influences). Speakers include his wife, his oncologist, a surgeon who runs the lung cancer screening program, his primary care physician, a spiritual panel composed of representatives from four different religions, and, finally, scientists developing cutting edge research into lung cancer treatment.

The class was actually opened to undergraduates as well as medical students. One such person, who is majoring in computer science and has no intention of going to medical school,

said "We all know someone who has experienced cancer, but we wish we could understand thatexperience better...knowing that he [Dr. Lin] has a limited time on earth, he was doing the things he loved...it helps guide me as I get closer to graduating and figuring out my next steps in life."

A first year medical student noted "We focus a lot on therapeutics and science and sometimes forget there is a human being on the other side...to hear Dr. Lin's human perspective, then look at it from an epidemiological level, really helps contextualize the conversations we're having."

I assume that Stanford is recording MED 275, as the course is not likely to be repeated, at least with Dr. Lin. I can only extend my own personal admiration and support to a courageous man.

Think about it.
